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Day 1 – Afternoon

12:30 Introduction to workshop agenda and proceedings. The work began at 12h30, at the venue Lord Hope Building, University of Strachclyde, Glasgow (Scotland - UK). The host, Cristina Costa, welcomed the participants and presented the agenda and the proceedings. After this, the coordinator, Maria Barbas (ESES, PT), asked the partners to present themselves. The Meeting followed with Maria Barbas's presentation of the Interim Report.

Maria Barbas made a summary of the 3 Transnational Meetings and described the essential information about the last Meeting in Santarém, Portugal. She then offered more information about the present phase of the project, including the publication of the first e-book and the prevision to publish some more. Finally she presented the whole schedule and all the partners agreeded.

To conclude, Maria Barbas announced that the multiplier event will take place in Lisbon, June, 2017, if all the partners agree.

Isabel Dias (Universidade Aberta, PT) then presented the data about the papers that have been published and disseminated among the students of the Higher School of Education that supported the related intellectual outputs.

Maria Barbas informed the group about Zenodo, a European platform for open access research and communities, after which Cristina Costa (Strachclyde University, GB) presented the update of the activities' report.

Loris Di Giammaria (Università La Sapienza, IT) presented the evolution of the Italian part of the project (dissemination).

Rebecca Kloza (Praxis und Wissenschaft, GR) handed out a leaflet and explained briefly the main characteristics of the Digital literacy for migrants' case study. All the intellectual outputs estimated and undertaken were presented.

After coffee break Elsa Casimiro (Viatecla, PT) made the presentation of the main issues regarding budget. Although all activities are in due course, the scientific, administrative and financial reports are still in need of further discussion, since the whole project will only be finished by August 2017. Besides, a follow up discussion on



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the remaining activities will be needed. Therefore the project leader proposed to have two additional project meetings, the first one to be held in Lisbon and the second one in Rome. The subject of the first one will be the activities' report and the status of the project and the second one will deal with the financial, administrative supporting documents. In both the project results follow up will be discussed for new proposals and partnerships. All the partners voted in favour of this proposal.

At **16h30** the meeting was over.

Day 2 – Morning

09:30 – Introduction: Gemma Gilliend (University of Strachclyde, UK) presented herself at the beginning of the meeting. Maria Barbas (ESES, PT) opened today's session by saying that since yesterday was a day to discuss the work done until now, today shall be about the next steps of the project, and she underlined the fact that cooperation between country teams is welcomed.

Mário Duarte (ESES, PT) presented Activity nr 7, the MOOC on Digital Employability (centered in 3 main aspects: employability, freelancing, entrepreneurship) and explained the direct relationship between these 3 aspects and digital literacy.

Maria Barbas informed that after the implementation of this MOOC papers should be submitted to conferences.

Pedro Matos (ESES, PT) presented the next activity: the construction of e-books on good practices and Maria Barbas asked the partners if the e-book structure could be the same as the one about digital literacy. She added that after the next multiplier event an e-book shall be edited with every paper presented.

Isabel Falé (Universidade Aberta, PT) explained when and where the next multiplier event will take place: 5th June in Lisbon, at Universidade Aberta – Palácio Ceia and Maria Barbas and Isabel Dias (Universidade Aberta, PT) added information about the meeting, namely in terms of what is expected from every participant.
